Section 1

Comparative Adverbs

1. الظروف المنتهية ب: (-ly)

- نضيف كلمة "more" قبل الظرف.
- أمثلة:

- quickly → more quickly (بسرعة أكبر)
- carefully → more carefully (بحرص أكبر)
- clearly → more clearly (بوضوح أكبر)

2. الظروف القصيرة: (Short Adverbs)

- نضيف (-er) إلى نهاية الظرف.
- أمثلة:

- hard → harder (بجد أكبر)
- fast → faster (بسرعة أكبر)

3. الظروف الشاذة: (Irregular Adverbs)

- لها صيغ مقارنة خاصة لا تتبع القواعد المعتادة.
- أمثلة:

- well → better (بشكل أفضل)
- badly → worse (بشكل أسوأ)





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### ملخص / Summary:

| Type of Adverb           | Rule (English)        | Rule (Arabic)               | Example<br>(Comparative) |
|--------------------------|-----------------------|-----------------------------|--------------------------|
| Adverbs ending<br>in -ly | Add more before       | قبل more نضيف<br>الظرف      | more carefully           |
| Short Adverbs            | Add -er to the<br>end | إلى نهاية -er نضيف<br>الظرف | faster                   |
| Irregular<br>Adverbs     | Special forms         | لها صيغ خاصة                | well → better            |

ملاحظة: هذه القواعد مشابهة جدًا لقواعد الصفات المقارنة (Comparative Adjectives)، لكنها تُستخدم لوصف الأفعال (كيف يتم فعل الشيء) وليس الأسماء.

Note: These rules are very similar to those for comparative adjectives, but they are used to describe verbs (how an action is done) rather than nouns.

**Examples**

**1. Examples Adverbs ending in -ly**

- She speaks **more quietly** than her sister.
- The new computer processes data **more efficiently**.
- Could you write **more neatly**, please?
- He explained the concept **more clearly** than the book.
- They finished the project **more quickly** than expected.

**2. Examples - Short adverbs**

- You need to work **harder** to achieve your goals.
- The athlete ran **faster** in the final race.
- Please come **earlier** tomorrow.
- She arrived **later** than usual.
- He shouted **louder** to get their attention.

**3. Example - Irregular adverbs**

- She sings **better** than anyone I know.
- He performed **worse** in the second exam.
- You should drive **farther/further** to find a gas station.
- I like this book **better** than the movie.

**4. - Comparison examples in sentences**

- My brother drives **more carefully** than I do.
- The new employee learns **faster** than the others.
- She speaks English **better than** her classmates.
- He behaved **worse** today than yesterday.
- The team played **more skillfully** in the second half.

- The sun shines **more brightly** in summer.
- You should think **more deeply** about this decision.
- He reacted **more calmly** to the news than I expected.
- Children usually learn languages **more easily** than adults.
