Bloom's Answer Key Model Answers | نموذج إجابة ورقة بلوم

Q	Level	Bloom Level	Model Answer
Q1	L1	Remembering	jacket / hoodie / thobe or any three: blouse, cardigan, jeans, headscarf, dress
Q2	L1	Remembering	always, every day, usually, often, sometimes, never, regularly
Q3	L2	Understanding	Overdressed = wearing too formal/fancy clothes for the occasion. Underdressed = wearing too casual/simple clothes. E.g., wearing a suit to a picnic = overdressed; wearing jeans to a formal wedding = underdressed.
Q4	L2	Understanding	Present Continuous is used because 'changing' describes a trend happening over a period — a changing situation. Translation: الموضة تتغير هذه الأيام.
Q5	L3	Applying	Sample: I usually wear jeans and a T-shirt on weekdays. This week I am trying a new style. I don't often wear formal clothes.
Q6	L3	Applying	Sample: I have a plain black jacket. The jacket is my favourite. An old pair of jeans is also in my wardrobe.
Q7	L4	Analysing	'She wears a uniform' = regular habit Present Simple. 'She is wearing a uniform today' = specific situation right now Present Continuous. The first is permanent; the second is temporary.
Q8	L4	Analysing	Pattern: plain, checked, striped, embroidered. Shape/Fit: baggy, loose-fitting. Patterns describe the design/surface; shape/fit words describe how clothes fit the body.
Q9	L5	Evaluating	For: 1 Uniforms promote equality. 2 They save time/money on choosing clothes. Counter: They limit individual expression.
Q10	L5	Evaluating	Agree. Example: We often judge people as 'professional' or 'unreliable' based on clothes, but clothes don't reveal character. A well-dressed person may be dishonest.
Q11	L6	Creating	Open answer. Must include: an occasion, at least 5 vocab items, Present Simple or Continuous, natural cohesion.
Q12	L6	Creating	Open answer. Must include: blog title, 6–8 sentences, correct tense usage, article usage, personal opinion clearly stated.
